- If you haven't already done so, install KBPublisher
- Create one or more categories to post articles under
- Add some users who will create content and publish it. Use the <u>Default User Privileges</u> article to hyelp determine which type of user(s) to create. If you already have a list of users in another database, consider <u>importing</u> them in to KBPublisher rather than adding each one individually.
- Add some articles. Likewise, if you have a lot of articles that already exist in another database, consider a <u>bulk import</u> of articles instead of typing them in individyally.
